Morning Routines – we're trying a new approach to our morning routines. The children from Green and Blue class have been arriving and 'milling about' (somewhat noisily!) in the hall; we're now going to use this 'pre-school time' as extra reading time for the children. They'll be expected to quietly come in and sit down in the hall with a book. We're also really working on children's independence in all classes – getting them to take greater personal responsibility for their organisation etc. Please help us in this by dropping your children at the door and leaving them to sort out their coats, bags etc., rather than providing an escort for them! Of course, parents are always welcome to come into school if you wish to talk with the class teacher etc., but we're trying to get the children to stand on their own two feet a bit more – and minimise disruption in the hall. Red Dragons will also now be able to enter straight into their cloakroom rather than going round the side of the school, saving the walk, and the inevitable traffic jams in the classroom!
