Dear all,

Another busy week at Ravensworth! On Monday, we took our trip to Richmond featuring the whole school, and, in spite of the rainy afternoon, we had a fantastic time.

Children in Red class have been busy writing poetry about the River Swale – having made all their observations on the day. Morgan told me that the waters “looked like coca cola” and Adam declared that, if he were the river, he'd be “really excited when I go crashing over the edge”! Max thought that the river was like someone “flying” and Jake said it “rumbled” like thunder. Here's their class poem, why not ask your child which line(s) they wrote?

The children, in their role as town planners, have come up with a huge variety of plans, some more feasible than others... whilst I'm sure that it would be possible to build a café on the banks of the river, or even an underwater observatory akin to 'The Deep', I'm less convinced about hollowing out the rocks on the far side to build an underground cavern housing a theme park... Still, it'll be up to them to persuade the council to run with their ideas, and prove whether or not the plans are cost effective! The children also met characters from history – the old lady of the mill, and the little drummer boy – discovering the secrets of the Swale's past...


